Our Next Big Build

As many of you are aware, the school received a grant of just over \$16million to upgrade our school facilities. Some of you attended a briefing and forum in March, and I'm now pleased to say the architects have returned with some great early plans as a result of the consultation.

A single storey building for OSHC, Community and Music is planned for the north end of the main block; this will connect with the gym, which is currently under construction.

Then a double story STEAM centre is planned for the south end of the main building. This will include brand new Science, Art and Technology spaces and the possible relocation of the library.

There will also be a major refurbishment of the main building; adding modern teaching spaces and some wonderful outdoor learning areas as well.

We are at an early design stage, but so far, it's looking **very exciting**.



Building Works

Work continues on our Gym. On completion, we will have a wonderful space for indoor sports activities, a housing for our assemblies and a terrific space for out of school events. We are hoping it will be ready to use at the start of 2022, and in the meantime, work progresses every day. A huge amount of soil has been moved and removed; in-ground services are now being put into place.
