Thankfully, the Education Department confirmed that we could go ahead with our evening events.

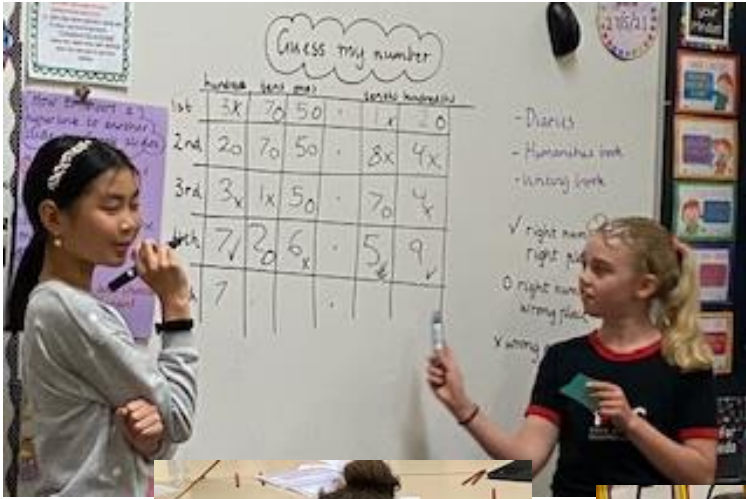
The media were ringing those familiar warnings. We still have to be so careful. A number of you have taken these precautions in recent months – so well done to you.

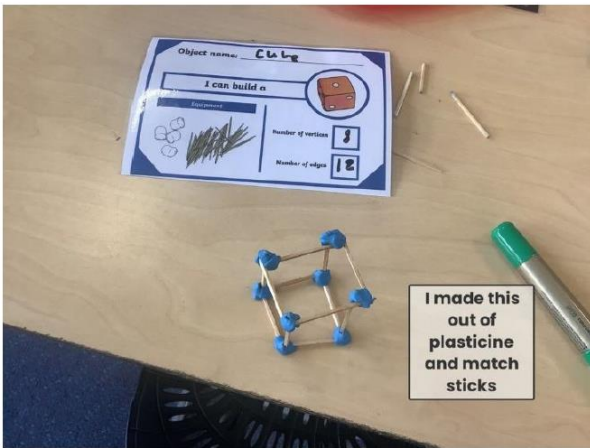
For the junior school, grades prep to grade two, the winners of the 'Active Traveller' award with 52% of students being active travellers, goes to Group 2.

For the senior school, grade three to six, the winners of the 'Active Traveller' award with 62.5% of students being active travellers, goes to Group 8.



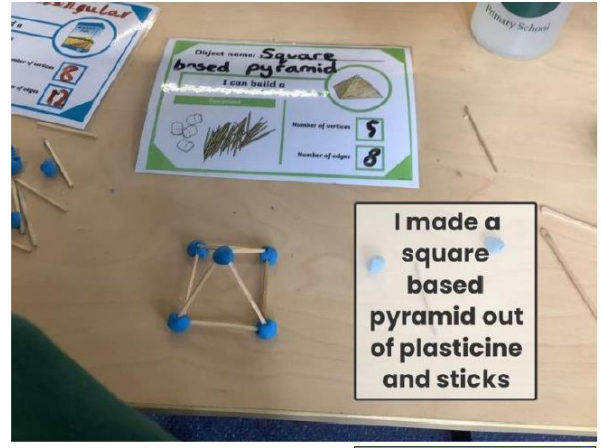

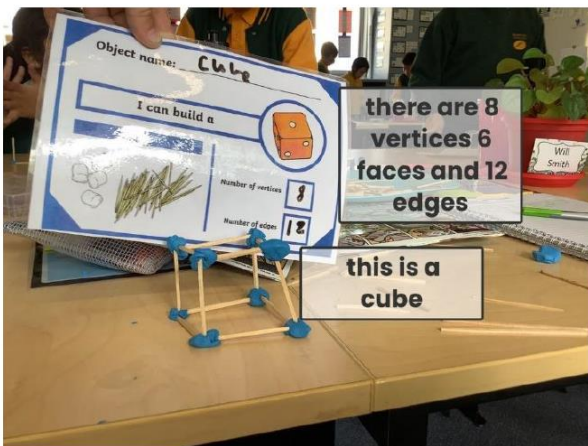
