

What a terrific evening it was at our community get together, the weather was perfect and families took advantage of being able to enjoy themselves on the grass (see <u>page 4</u> for more photos).


Occupational Therapy Students

Junior School

In **Grade 1** this term we are learning to confidently identify our left and right hands, recognise the vowel signs, and sign our numbers 1-10. We have begun looking at stories in sign and we are beginning to discuss the facial expressions and body language used by signers when telling a story. The **Grade 2** students begin every lesson by signing an acknowledgement of country. In Grade 2 the focus this term is on *receptive language*; watching someone sign and recognising what is being signed. We practise signing each others names, some of our spelling sight words, and numbers. These pictures show some of our Grade 2 students asking each other 'how old are you?'





Middle School

This term the Grade 3/4 students are learning to rely on their signing and switch off their voices. We are practising this by playing games and asking each other questions. The students are learning to sign days of the week, seasons, months and useful words like 'today', 'yesterday' and 'tomorrow'. The Grade 3/4s are also watching signed stories without a translation and working on understanding what is being signed.



Senior School



In Grade 5/6 we began our term by discussing the languages represented in our school. We are diverse! The Grade 5/6 students are now competently signing basic vocab, letters and numbers. They are gaining mastery in their fingerspelling and beginning to learn to sign times on the clock.


