Victorian Government's Announcement on Explicit Instruction

You may have heard in the media that recently the Education Minister. The Hon. Ben Carroll. announced mandates to reading instruction (namely phonics instruction), and reforms to the Victorian Teaching and Learning Model (VTLM). This announcement follows other jurisdictions such as NSW and the Catholic system in Victoria. Reservoir Primary School has a well established phonics program, and we incorporate explicit instruction into our Instructional Model at all ages. We look forward to further refining our practice when new resources are released.

VISUAL ART PROGRAM Term 2 Update 2024

PREP STUDENTS - YAYOI KASUMA

Our talented Prep students have gained valuable insights from studying the life and artistry of Japanese-American artist Yayoi Kusama. We analyzed both 2D and 3D artworks featuring mushrooms, flowers, and pumpkins, and then recreated our own masterpieces using some of Kusama's techniques. Please enjoy these pictures showcasing our completed work.

JUNIOR STUDENTS - COMMUNITY

Year 1 and 2 students delved into the theme of "Community" through the exploration of Indigenous Australian artworks depicting Songlines or Dreaming tracks. We studied the artworks Yarrkalpa (Hunting Ground) 2013 and Ngurrara: The Great Sandy Desert Canvas 1997. Key insights included understanding how communities of artists collaboratively create artworks by sharing stories and cultural meanings through depictions of ancestral lands. To apply these learnings, students crafted their own artworks using aerial maps of Reservoir Primary School. Additionally, we explored underground elements and enjoyed creating geodes and gemstones for added fun.

MIDDLE STUDENTS - MULTICULTURALISM

Year 3 and 4 students explored cultural artworks from various parts of the world to link to their Humanities theme this term. Students learnt how Japanese artisans hand build Kokeshi dolls to reflect the cultural identity of local children. They studied the cultural significance of the Koru shape from Maori culture then explored Indian mandalas while learnign about symmetry, balance and colour harmony.



SENIOR STUDENTS - STEAMPUNK

Senior students explored the contrast between the historical and futuristic elements of Steampunk, connecting the era of machine power with migration to Australia. We examined popular icons and symbols in the Steampunk movement, explored their links to pop culture, and identified distinctive colour schemes and textures from artworks we viewed. Students later utilised recycled materials and various found objects to build their own Steampunk creations.

Students in Years 5 and 6 have had a great time this term creating a working model using light bulbs, buzzers and motors.




